

READING AND UNDERSTANDING THE FORMAT FOR PROPOSED LOCAL RULE AMENDMENTS

Proposed Amendments to Local Rules are indicated using the following format:

1. Language that is proposed to be removed from an existing Rule is stricken with a 'strikeout' line, as illustrated by the following example:

LRCiv 99 Existing Rule

(a) This is an existing Rule. ~~This language is hereby deleted from the existing Rule.~~

2. Language that is proposed to be added to an existing Rule, or a newly-proposed rule, is indicated by underlining the new language. Proposed added language follows language that is proposed to be deleted from an existing Rule, as illustrated in the following example:

LRCiv 99 Existing Rule

(a) This is an existing Rule. ~~This language is hereby deleted from the existing Rule~~ and the Rule is hereby amended with these words.

3. Omission of a word or words -- such as a subparagraph -- within an existing Rule for which an amendment is proposed, is indicated by the insertion of three (3) asterisks into the Proposed Rule Amendment, as illustrated in the following example:

LRCiv 99 Existing Rule

(a) This is the existing Rule. ~~This language is hereby deleted from the existing Rule~~ and the Rule is hereby amended with these words.

(e) This Rule must conform with the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

Omission of the full text of a proposed amendment to an existing rule has been done in the interest of brevity, hopefully making it easier for the reader to review the Proposed Rule Amendment.
