






District Civil Case Filings












District Judge Time in Court


District Judge Time in Court by Division




District Judge Average Time in Court by Division



Magistrate Judge Time in Court





Magistrate Judge Time in Court by Division






Magistrate Judge Average Time in Court by Division



Tucson Division Total Criminal Trials







District Misdemeanor Dispositions - Magistrate Judges







District Consent Case Dispositions - Magistrate Judges




