2013-2014 SCOTUS REVIEW

During its past term, the United States Supreme Court decided a number of cases touching on fundamental issues in the exercise of government power. These cases involved constitutional provisions that had never been interpreted before, statues of intense political interest, and the outer limits of the President's power.

Professor David Marcus of the University of Arizona will recap the Court's recently-ended term by providing critical summaries of four of the year's most important cases. These include ***Bond v. United States***, ***Burwell v. Hobby Lobby***, ***Town of Greece v. Galloway***, and ***NLRB v. Noel Canning***.

Prof. Marcus is a professor of law at the University of Arizona Rogers College of Law, where he teaches and writes on civil procedure, complex litigation, and legal history. Prior to joining the College's faculty, he clerked for two federal judges and represented consumers in large class actions. Prof. Marcus is a graduate of Harvard College and Yale Law School, and he has taught at Yale and Stanford in addition to Arizona.
