Senior Judge Hawkins will speak about Marcus Aurelius Smith and Ralph Henry Cameron, two Arizonans deeply involved in the effort to bring statehood to Arizona. Both were Territorial Delegates and then U.S. Senators and were involved in the creation of new counties. Their similarities ended there.

Senior Judge Rosenblatt will provide a brief oral history of the late Chief District Judge John Roll and will recount the story of Judge Edmund Wells, who lived and prospered from Arizona's territorial days through statehood and beyond.

Dr. Williams will give a brief overview of the Ninth Judicial Circuit Historical Society's work in educating the public about the legal heritage of all the courts of the Ninth Circuit.
