This 1947 decision of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit upheld a district court's decision that enjoined California school districts in Orange County from the practice of segregation. United States Circuit Judge Mary Murguia will discuss the Mendez decision and how it changed the course of history by setting in motion significant developments in law and politics. She will also describe how the Mendez decision changed the lives of students and families, including her own.

The first Latina to serve on the U.S. District Court of Arizona, Judge Murguia was confirmed as a federal district court judge in October 2000 and was appointed as a circuit judge in January 2011.
