





District Weighted Civil Case Filings







District Weighted Civil Case Terminations























District Judge Time in Court




District Judge Time in Court by Division



District Judge Average Time in Court








Magistrate Judge Time in Court by Division



Magistrate Judge Average Time in Court




Magistrate Judge Average Time in Court by Division









Phoenix Division Criminal Trials





District Criminal Trial Length (Jury and Non-Jury)






Tucson Division Criminal Trial Length (Jury and Non-Jury)





Division Petty Offense Dispositions - Magistrate Judges





Division Misdemeanor Dispositions - Magistrate Judges





Division Consent Case Dispositions - Magistrate Judges






