Data sets are compiled from the most recent fiscal year (October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020) in the areas of civil and criminal caseload, district and magistrate judge workload, jury and naturalization, and probation. When available, data from previous fiscal years are provided for comparison.

Disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic have resulted in a decrease in both civil and criminal areas in Fiscal Year 2020.
