

## Federal Court Advice Only Clinic Free Civil Legal Help Volunteer Lawyers Program

Wish you could talk to an attorney about your federal civil case for free?

The Volunteer Lawyers Program/ Community Legal Services offers as a public service 30 minute appointments of free phone advice from volunteer lawyers for people who are representing themselves (do not have a lawyer) in a civil case in federal court or are considering filing a case.

To participate in the Federal Court Advice Only Clinic you must be:

- 1) representing yourself (do not have an attorney); and
- 2) involved in or considering filing a CIVIL federal case (a case arising under federal law or a case in which the parties reside in different states and the amount in controversy is \$75,000 or more). The clinic cannot provide advice about criminal cases.
- Appointments are by appointment only, by phone, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays each month.
- The clinic does not arrange attorneys to represent you in Court.
- There are no income requirements to be eligible.
