16	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, unless otherwise ordered by the Court, authority to
17 18	approve applications to appear pro hac vice pursuant to Local Rule of Civil Procedure
19	83.1(b)(3) is delegated to the Attorney Admissions Clerk, or deputy designated by the Clerk
20	of Court, subject to the following restrictions:
21	• The court-approved application must be properly completed and all information
22	provided in accordance with the requirements of Local Rule of Civil Procedure 83.1.
23	• The applicant must meet all eligibility requirements as set forth in LRCiv 83.1(b)(3).
24	• The applicant may not have any past or pending disciplinary actions.
25	• The applicant may not reside in Arizona, be regularly employed in Arizona, or appear
26	to principally practice in Arizona.
27	In addition to the aforementioned restrictions, the Attorney Admissions Clerk shall
20	forward to the presiding judge any application for which approval eligibility is uncertain.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT any person who wishes to object or otherwise appeal the action taken by the Attorney Admissions Clerk as approving official may file such objection or appeal with the presiding judicial officer.
