16	The volume of criminal cases brought before the Tucson Division, United States
17	District Court for the District of Arizona, for presentment at initial appearances, presents an
18	atypical burden on the Court, the United States Pretrial Services Office, and the United States
19	Marshal Service, ¹
20	Therefore, IT IS ORDERED:
21	1. Initial appearances for adult detainees in the Tucson Division, United States
22	District Court, are scheduled for 2:00 p.m. each business weekday that the Court is in
23	session. When an individual has been detained and arrested, the law enforcement agent shall
24	notify the magistrate judge that the individual will be presented for initial appearance. The
25	agent shall deliver to the judicial assistant of the duty magistrate judge conducting initial

appearances five copies of the paper complaint for each detainee, two of which will be subscribed and sworn to by the law enforcement agent in the presence of the duty magistrate, by no later than 1:15 p.m. on the day of the initial appearance;

2. Initial appearances for juvenile detainees in the Tucson Division, United States

- 2. Initial appearances for juvenile detainees in the Tucson Division, United States District Court, are scheduled for 1:15 p.m. each business weekday that the Court is in session. When a juvenile has been detained and arrested, the law enforcement agent shall notify the magistrate judge that the juvenile will be presented for initial appearance. The agent shall deliver the charging information and appended documents to the judicial assistant of the duty magistrate judge conducting initial appearances by no later than 1:00 p.m. on the day of the initial appearance, and be sworn in by the duty magistrate for a probable cause determination before the 1:15 p.m. juvenile initial appearance;
- 3. Any detainee for whom timely notification to the magistrate judge has not been completed AND/OR any detainee whose paperwork has not been timely provided to the judicial assistant as set forth herein will not be placed on the initial appearance calendar for that day, but will be brought for presentment at the next immediate and scheduled initial appearance, *provided* notification is timely completed and paperwork is timely provided on the next immediate and scheduled initial appearance day;
- 4. "Notify the magistrate judge" as used in this general order means to contact, by telephone, by no later than 10:30 a.m., the judicial assistant of the duty magistrate judge conducting initial appearances that day to provide the name, dates of birth and arrest, and charge for the detainee who will be brought for an initial appearance.
