GENERAL ORDER 24-14

The Court issues the following Order to address the entry of 8 U.S.C. § 1326 supervised release cases, into the Supervised Release File (SRF) of Access to Law Enforcement System (ATLAS).


On October 1, 2024, the Federal Bureau of Investigations decommissioned the Flash Notification process. As a result, the U.S. Probation and Pretrial Services Office is required to enter into the SRF of ATLAS, all supervised release cases, including cases involving defendants convicted of 8 U.S.C. § 1326. The Probation Office does not have the workforce capacity to track and investigate the large number of inactive 8 U.S.C. § 1326 supervised release cases in this District.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED,

1. The Probation Office will verify deportation of all defendants in supervised release cases involving a conviction under 8 U.S.C. § 1326.
2. If deportation cannot be verified within 30 days, the defendant will be entered into SRF of ATLAS and monitored until deportation can be confirmed.
3. Once deportation has been verified, the Probation Office is not required to enter the defendant into SRF of ATLAS.
