GENERAL ORDER 22-25

17 **SUPERSEDES GENERAL ORDER 22-17**

18 WHEREAS the Chief Judge of this Court is required by the CARES Act to “review
19 the authorization [to conduct various proceedings by video and audio conferencing] and
20 determine whether to extend the authorization,” CARES Act § 15002(b)(3)(A);

21 NOW THEREFORE it is ordered extending the authorization to conduct various
22 proceedings by video and audio conferencing authorized by the CARES Act through
23 December 14, 2022. It is further ordered as follows:

24 **Flagstaff Courthouse**

25 1. VTC and telephonic proceedings are authorized to occur in the Flagstaff
26 courthouse to the full extent authorized by the CARES Act upon the required findings of
27 the designated district judge, magistrate judge, or the Chief Judge or his designee.

28 2. Central Violations Bureau cases in Flagstaff, Kingman, Page, and the Grand
 Canyon may proceed.

Yuma Courthouse

- 1. VTC and telephonic proceedings are authorized to occur in the Yuma courthouse to the full extent authorized by the CARES Act upon the required findings of the designated district judge, magistrate judge, or the Chief Judge or his designee.
- 2. Central Violations Bureau cases may proceed.

Phoenix and Tucson Courthouses


- 1. VTC and telephonic proceedings are authorized to occur in the Phoenix and Tucson courthouses to the full extent authorized by the CARES Act upon the required findings of the designated district judge, magistrate judge, or the Chief Judge or his designee.
- 2. Central Violations Bureau cases may proceed.

Requirements for Occupants of Courthouses Within the District of Arizona

- 1. Naturalization ceremonies and all non-case related activities scheduled in the courthouses may resume. This includes mock trials, CLE events, school tours, etc.
- General Order 22-17 is superseded by this Order.

The Court reserves the right to amend or rescind this General Order at any time due to changing public health statistics and circumstances.
